# The Children's Center at UCP of Long Island Reveals Multi-Sensory Room for Children with Disabilities



**Commack, NY** – The Children's Center at UCP of Long Island celebrated the grand opening of its Snoezelen Room at the school on October 11<sup>th</sup>. The room was funded through a grant from the CME Group Community Foundation.

“The new multi-sensory room is now available for our students to use and will impact their lives in so many ways,” said Principal Sherri Glazer. “It will aid in their learning, development, sensory needs and attention, not to mention communication. We are thrilled to have this very unique sensory room in our building.”

First developed in the 1970s in the Netherlands, a sensory room offers both stimulation and relaxation for children and adults with disabilities by using lighting effects, tactile surfaces and sounds to excite the senses.

“We are so thankful that the CME Group Community Foundation has provided our students with this wonderful room,” Glazer said.

The CME Group Community Foundation provides charitable grants focused on meeting the needs of global communities. The Foundation seeks to provide particular support to three areas of concern: children in need, education, health and human services. The foundation selected The Children's Center through a grant application and has supported UCP of Long Island since 2011.

The Children's Center is in the forefront of Early Intervention, Preschool, and School Age programming, serving over 70 infants and children with disabilities. The Center uses specialty programs such as a feeding program - Food Exploration and Sensory Techniques (F.E.A.S.T.) and assistive technology services. The school continues to introduce new and innovative programs designed to meet the needs of children with disabilities and their families.
